


- Landscape- a work of art that shows the features of the natural environment (trees, lakes, mountains, etc)

Atmospheric Perspective

The illusion of distance created by muting color and blurring detail as an object gets farther away.





Horizon- the division of earth and sky seen by an observer





Parts of a landscape

- Foreground- the area of the landscape that is closest to you and thus larger, brighter, and more detailed.
- Middle ground- the area of the landscape below the horizon that is between the foreground and background.
- Background- the area of a landscape that is the farthest from you and thus more muted, less detailed and smaller.




Analysis Of Atmospheric Perspective in a landscape






